

BAKE WITH BROOKE by Brooke Morita

Lemon Bars



1 cup softened butter 2 ¹/₃ cups flour 2 cups sugar 4 eggs ²/₃ cup lemon juice Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Mix together softened butter, 2 cups flour and $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar until well blended. Press evenly into the bottom of an ungreased 9"x13" pan. Bake for 15-20 minutes until firm and golden. In another bowl, whisk together the remaining 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ cups sugar and cup flour with the eggs and lemon juice. Pour over the baked crust. Bake for an additional 20-25 minutes. Lemon filling will set as it cools. Cut into squares and serve.

Pro Tip: Add a pinch of salt to the crust to cut the sweetness. Or if you have a sweet tooth, top your bars off with a dusting of powdered sugar.

MAINTAINING YARDS AND WASTE

Grass Clippings: Please do not allow your grass clippings to go into the street when mowing, raking, or blowing off sidewalks. Rain will carry the clippings into the storm sewers which will eventually clog and force storm water into basements. If you have a lawn service, please make them aware that clippings should not be placed into the street.

Tree Trimming: Please trim your tree branches so that they do not hang over the sidewalks or roadways. Low hanging tree branches over sidewalks pose a danger to walker and bike riders. Low hanging branches over roadways or parking areas pose a danger to cars and drivers.

Sidewalk Safety: Please inspect your sidewalks regularly for cracks or buckling sidewalks that need to be repaired. Cracked or buckling sidewalks cause a safety hazard for anyone using the sidewalk that could lead to bodily injury. Cracked and buckling sidewalks also cause a potential hazard to the borough's infrastructure with water runoff and other debris entering the storm sewers.



MY TOP 3 EASY TO GROW AND STORE GARDEN PICKS: By Jillian Snyder

Garden preparation and planning has already begun, and I thought I would share my favorite easy to grow garden picks, and if done in larger quantities can store for a long time given the right conditions.

- 1. Potatoes
- 2. Beans
- 3. Quinoa

Not willing to give up yard space for a garden? Try food suitable planters or alternatives to create a garden space that fits your yard. A tall, food safe barrel or planter is a great way to grow potatoes. Then if you take a few small, but sturdy wood supports around the top edge of the barrel in the potting soil, and then zip tie netting around the supports, you can successfully grow beans together with your potatoes.



Potatoes and Beans: Last year in my own garden I tried the potato and bean companion planting method, and I can say the trials in my garden were successful. The potato bed that I used this duo together gave me larger potatoes, versus just the potato bed. My preference for beans are ones that are good for dry storing, (which I let dry on the vine), such as the Cherokee Trail of Tears or Cannellini beans). The best part of all, you can take as many as you want of your dried beans, and plant them again next year!

Quinoa: A colorful quinoa is not only easy to grow, but easy to process as a home grower. The best part is, after leaving it to dry, you can thresh it whenever is convenient for you.
