BAKE WITH BROOKE By Brooke Morita, Councilwoman

Banana Bread



3-4 very ripe bananas, mashed 1 cup sugar 1 egg ¼ cup melted butter 1 tsp vanilla extract 1 ½ cups flour 1 tsp baking powder 1 tsp salt

Pinch (or more) of cinnamon

Preheat the oven to 325 degrees. Combine bananas, sugar, egg, butter, and vanilla in a large bowl. Mix flour, baking powder, salt, and cinnamon together in a separate bowl; stir into banana mixture until just mixed. Don't be tempted to overmix! Pour batter into a greased loaf pan. Bake for approximately 1 hour or until a toothpick inserted into the center of bread comes out clean.

Pro Tip: You can spice up your banana bread by adding chopped walnuts, craisins or chocolate chips. Stir them in gently at the very end, just before you pour the batter into your pan. Don't be afraid to be creative!

WATER METER READING TIPS

Our staff reads your water meter every quarter. Please keep your meter accessible so our staff can quickly read your meter on the first visit to your property. Here are some tips on how to keep your meter accessible.

Trees & Bushes

- Trim bushes and trees that block the way or cover the meter. During the growing season, plants can cover a water meter box very quickly.
- Bees and insects. Please check your property's water meter regularly for bee or insect nests to assure the safety of our staff.
- Please minimize plants in the area which meter readers must travel to get to your meter. We would like to avoid any
 accidental damage to your prized plantings. We will not read your meter if we cannot access it. This could cause you an
 extra fee for not allowing access to our staff to obtain a proper reading.

Pets

- Keep pets away from the path that leads to your meter.
- If you have a guard dog for security, please let us know so that we can make sure that our meter readers and other utility personnel are aware of this.
- We may ask that you arrange to confine the dog during the day that your meter will be read.

Objects that cover or block your meter

• Please make sure that no objects cover or block access to the meter box. Items we have found blocking water meters include cars, trailers, garbage cans and recycling bins, construction equipment or supplies.

Locked Gates

• If your meter is located behind a gate that is normally kept locked, please contact us to arrange access. We can arrange to have you read your meter if you plan with us ahead of time.

Your Address

- Please ensure your house address is clearly displayed on your residence.
- If you change your PO Box # please notify the office.
- This also assists emergency personnel who may need to find your home in a hurry.

WEEDING THROUGH THE GARDEN TERMINOLOGY

It's that time of year again where gardeners are dreaming and making ambitious plans for their gardens. As the seed catalogs roll in, and seed displays begin popping up all over the stores, my hope is to help you weed through the seed terminology.

So what seed variety is the best for your garden? Let's take a quick and simplified look at heirloom, hybrid, organic, open-pollinated, and genetically modified organisms (GMO) to help you decide.

- 1. Organic: A USDA Organic seal on a seed package refers to the practice and condition of which the plants were grown. In this case, seeds are derived from plants that were grown without the use of synthetic chemical pesticides.
- 2. Heirloom seeds speak to the lineage of the seed, not the growing practices. Heirloom seeds are grown from open-pollinated plants, that are reliable in passing on similar characteristics of the parent plants, to the offspring plants, from year to year.
- 3. Open-pollination just refers to the means in which pollination can occur (insects, wind, birds, or any other natural means).
- 4. Hybrid seeds are naturally derived from plants that have been purposefully cross pollinated with one another to create a new variety that embodies the desired characteristics from each parent plant. Unlike saving seeds from a heirloom variety, saving hybrid seeds to use from year to year will most likely have unpredictable results. Hybrid seeds will often have a (F1) designation on the seed packet.
- 5. GMO- Seeds are modified using not naturally occurring methods, to ensure a desired trait is achieved. Gardeners are unable to save seeds after harvest and must buy seeds every year. As of now, GMO seeds are not readily available to home gardeners, and I'll let you make the choice if this is for the better.

So, if you are not looking to save the seeds from year-to-year hybrid or heirloom seeds are a fine choice for you. If you are looking to harvest your plants and save your seeds from year to year, then heirloom varieties are a better fit. Lastly, if growing practices are important to you, consider going organic!



MAINTAINING YARDS AND WASTE

Grass Clippings:

Please do not allow your grass clipping to go into the street when mowing, raking, or blowing off sidewalks. Rain will carry the clippings into the storm sewers which will eventually clog and force storm water into basements. If you have a lawn service, please make them aware too.

Weeds Growing on Sidewalks and Curbs:

Please remove weeds growing on your sidewalk and curbs in warm months to keep the borough looking nice for everyone.

Trash:

If wind or storms are expected, please secure your trash so that the trash does not blow out of containers into the borough streets or onto your neighbor's properties.

Snow:

Please do not shovel or blow snow into the, this creates a driving hazard. Snow/Ice must be removed from your sidewalks within 6 hours of the end of the snow/ice precipitation, to prevent slip and falls and to help keep walkers from having to walk in the roadways.

We can all work together to keep our borough looking nice and remaining safe!
